

Your Role as a Member of the
Lebanon County Criminal Justice Advisory Board (LCCJAB)

As a Member of the LCCJAB, you will be expected to:

- 1) Be willing, able and prepared to participate in free and open discussion with your colleagues.
- 2) Be aware of the trends that commonly present themselves as matters of concern within your department.
- 3) Understand that inter-departmental collaboration and communication is critical to the future growth of criminal justice departments in Lebanon County.
- 4) Know that you as the leader of your department are in charge of *how* anything the Board discusses will ultimately be implemented (or not) in your office.
- 5) Know that there are moments when negotiation and compromise will have to take place. Consensus, however, is always the preferred solution.
- 6) Attend the meetings regularly so that you stay informed of the issues being presented and are able to appropriately represent your agency.
- 7) Have read the Bylaws of the LCCJAB at least one time.
- 8) Submit questions as concerns about the Board to the LCCJAB Planner/Grant Coordinator when or if you have them so that she may discuss any problems with our Chairman.
- 9) Participate, when necessary, in electronic voting requests about initiatives under consideration by the Board.
- 10) Know that on this Board concerns may be equally expressed without the threat of retaliation. Our Board demands decent, non-hostile conduct during meetings.
